CALL TO ORDER: 7:14pm 26 members present

COMMUNICATIONS: CORRESPONDENCE, UPCOMING EVENTS

The club completed another successful swap meet at Pettibone school and was able to donate several hundred dollars to Southbury Ambulance. Unfortunately, we have had several plane crashes outside of our usual flight area and Bill asks the club to look for ways to mitigate these events. In addition, one member had a run in with an electric plane prop that required an ER visit. Due to this event the club has instituted some additional guidelines. These include restraining all planes while starting and only arming electrics on the starting tables while they are restrained. Also flying fast low passes on the far side of the field.
- Bob Motta informed the club of several swap meets in the coming months.

- Ron Faanes....Principle of Flight update. Ron continues to lead this very successful program. He has expanded the event with mini drones, kites, boomerangs, and rc cars. He has discovered that additional insurance may be needed in some cases, and he will contact the AMA for assistance.  permits.

• Assemble Warming Hut. Glenn confirmed that the winter structure will be

reassembled when the weather gets cold enough.
